Achievements

JUNIOR LANDCARE	Kalgoorlie-Boulder Primary schools were involved in the Junior Landcare Programme this year through KBULG conducting Bushwalks within Karlkurla Bushland Park and Tree Planting Projects with the schools. KBULG also presented talks at schools and participated in school expositions.
NEWSLETTER	KBULG continued to produce two community newsletters which were published as four pages, including a full page centre spread in Saturday's Kalgoorlie Miner. With approximately 15,000 copies printed, we are reaching a wide audience.
RECONSTRUCTED ART COMPETITION	The rECOnstructed Art Competition & Exhibition in November 2022 encouraged members of the community to source and utilise waste products and materials to create innovative pieces of art. Reduce—Reuse—Recycle, celebrated as part of National Recycling week and exhibited at the Museum of the Goldfields.
CLEAN UP DAY	KBULG again hosted the "Clean Up Kalgoorlie-Boulder Day" in conjunction with Clean up Australia Day. In May 2023 over 40 residents of the community cleaned up bushland at Mt Charlotte reservoir, one of Kalgoorlie-Boulder's most prominent landmarks associated with great historical significance.
TIDY TOWNS & SUSTAINABLE CITIES AWARDS	KBULG entered Kalgoorlie-Boulder into the 2021-2022 Tidy Towns Sustainable Communities Awards and was awarded as winner of the "Heritage and Culture" category.
SUSTAINABLE GARDEN QUEST	KBULG held its annual Sustainable Garden Quest in September 2022 in conjunction with the major sponsors Kalgoorlie Miner and Water Corporation. The competition focused on all aspects of creating and maintaining a sustainable garden, the overall appearance, colour and tidiness of gardens and verges.
COMMUNITY TREE PLANTING DAY	KBULG coordinated the annual Community Tree Planting day in collaboration with the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder and core sponsors. The site for 2022 was an area between Centennial Park and Meldrum Avenue in close proximity to Gribble Creek. Over two hours, 4000 seedlings were planted by approximately 200 volunteers.
COMMUNITY NURSERY	Over 2022/2023 KBULG's Community Nursery within Karlkurla Bushland Park was open to the public every weekday from 8am-12pm. Staff members assisted community enquiries and provided a wealth of information about garden maintenance and plant propagation to community members.
KARLKURLA BUSHLAND PARK	KBULG continually supports the Kalgoorlie-Boulder City Council with the park management, along with organising bush walks, tree plantings and school projects. Improvements to the park over the last few years include trail upgrades and updated signage.
GIFSA	KBULG continues to support the Goldfields Individual Family Support Association (GIFSA) through encouraging people living with disabilities and their carers to further develop interests & to take advantage of training opportunities at the Karlkurla Community Nursery.
SCATTER THE SILKY PEAR	This program enables tourists to pick up a brochure and a packet of Karlkurla seeds (for a small donation) from the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Visitor Centre and scatter them at designated locations within Karlkurla Bushland Park. Funds from seeds sold contribute to projects within Karlkurla Bushland Park.
REGENERATION ZONES	A series of fenced Regeneration Zones encompass an area of approximately 3,500 hectares around Kalgoorlie-Boulder. The Regeneration Zones safeguard habitat fragments for endemic species with locally restricted habitats such as rare <i>Eremophila</i> species. KBULG carries out continuous awareness-raising through the media and the organisation's newsletter, educating the community to preserve the buffer zones' environment. KBULG also undertakes strategic audits of the regeneration zones, evaluating the adequacy of existing fencing and identifying issues arising from illegal rubbish dumping and weed infestations.
PUBLIC AWARENESS AND PROMOTION	KBULG frequently gets out and about within the community to promote the local environment and the importance of living sustainably. This is achieved by attending community events like the Spring Festival, KBCCI Community Expo, schools and public/group forums, in addition to KBULG's own education and conservation events/projects.
RECYCLING	KBULG continues its ongoing support of the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder with community awareness promotion and education in regards to waste cycle management, with a particular focus on recycling. KBULG constantly advocates for business and commercial recycling in the Kalgoorlie-Boulder area, including the highly successful Containers for Change program.
MEMBERSHIP	KBULG consistently promotes its services, projects & activities throughout the community and continues to welcome new members. In 2022-2023 our organisation had over 650 members.

To achieve all of the organisation's goals and objectives, KBULG is strongly reliant on the support of its long-term core sponsors: The City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder and Northern Star Resources - Kalgoorlie Operations. With Lynas Rare Earths we have recently acquired another core sponsor and we are looking forward to a fruitful collaboration. Over 2022-2023 KBULG has also received additional support from Keep Australia Beautiful WA, the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation, the Water Corporation, Rotary and Cleanaway.

Over 2022/2023 KBULG also successfully required funding for the 2023/2024 construction of a much anticipated, fully inclusive nature playground within Karlkurla Bushland Park from the Government of Western Australia (\$600,000), the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder (\$400,000) and Northern Star Resources Kalgoorlie Operations (\$100,000).

Our sponsors provide crucial continuous funding required for the development and implementation of all of KBULG's projects including Junior Landcare activities, tree-planting events, the publication of KBULG's Community Newsletters, upkeep of Karlkurla Bushland Park, operation of KBULG's fully inclusive Community Nursery, Regeneration Zone Management and numerous other projects and activities in addition to KBULG's general administration duties.

Our core sponsors are vital for enabling us to maintain the profile, respect and credibility that we hold within the community. KBULG maintains strong links and working relationships with all of our core sponsors, mining companies and businesses in the region, who provide in-kind support to our programs and initiatives.

The KBULG committee consists of a large and diverse group of individuals, including representatives from government, local industries and members of the community.

The elected Committee supports and guides the KBULG CEO in relation to any arising issues, along with offering advice on project management decisions, as required. The committee also provides input in regards to strategic planning and overall direction for the group.

KBULG employs a fulltime paid CEO. Kim Eckert has been employed within this position since January 2013. Kim is accountable for the day-to-day management and coordination of the organisation, under direction from the KBULG committee.

The KBULG CEO is responsible for developing and maintaining effective community liaison avenues, reaching a high diversity of groups and organisations, and consequently involving community members from all socio-economic backgrounds. The CEO ensures that projects are adequately devised, implemented, maintained and monitored. Major tasks overseen by the CEO include project development and funding, public education initiatives and coordination of community events. KBULG's staff also liaise with the Council, schools, government departments, sponsors and the media on local environmental projects and issues.

The Kalgoorlie-Boulder Urban Landcare Group coordinates and promotes many projects and is associated with a large range of activities around the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder. All of KBULG's engagements are coordinated from the KBULG office, located within Karlkurla Bushland Park.

Environmental & Community Achievements

- KBULG organised its very first Recycled Art Competition and Exhibition, named "rECOnstructed", in November 2009. In 2022, now in its 13th year, the competition and exhibition was viewed by thousands of people at the Western Australian Museum of the Goldfields. The competition was again extremely successful with a great turnout from local community members, with the artworks displaying some incredible artistic talent in the Goldfields.
- Over 200 volunteers planted around 4000 trees, shrubs and groundcover plants, between Centennial Park and Meldrum Avenue in close proximity to Gribble Creek at KBULG's Annual Community Tree Planting Day in July 2022.
- In 2022/2023 over 60,000 plants were propagated in KBULG's nursery, providing the necessary stock for tree planting events around town, and allowing thousands of plants to be donated to local community groups, schools and the community.
- A number of gardening enthusiasts entered their gardens into KBULG's 2022 Sustainable Garden Quest Competition. Judges were extremely impressed by the gardens' creative layouts, displaying innovative aspects of waterwise gardening, productive edible gardens and the use of native, drought-adapted plants.
- Hundreds of students from all of Kalgoorlie-Boulder's primary and secondary schools participated in KBULG's Junior Landcare Program over 2022/2023. Frequently organised activities included tailor-made educational bushwalks, tree planting events on school grounds and classroom talks adapted to the individual needs and interests of classes.
- Updating promotional and community educational material continues to be a key focus of our organisation. KBULG maintains a strong social media presence, and is constantly working on updating existing educational materials and interpretive signage across Karlkurla Bushland Park.

- KBULG's methods of dispersing educative materials are constantly adapting to evolving trends of information acquisition across the population. KBULG is consequently consistently working on updating its communication techniques by conveying information through as many channels as possible including our website, emails, Facebook, Skype and engagement of local media.
- KBULG continues to promote the conservation significance of the Great Western Woodlands through conducting educational bushwalks for school students from local schools and visiting schools from the region, at community events and school visits, and through donating and distributing the Great Western Woodlands field guide & pamphlets to schools, sponsors and community partners.
- All outcomes were achieved within this reporting period across all projects and activities. All measurable outcomes relating to projects and activities have exceeded those from previous years.

Turning a Grassroots Movement into 50 years of Environmental Advocacy: Celebrating 50 Years of KBULG

In March 2023 KBULG celebrated its 50th anniversary of bringing people together to lobby for the conservation of the unique Great Western Woodlands surrounding Kalgoorlie-Boulder.

The environmental movement in Kalgoorlie-Boulder was firstly initiated by the Goldfields Dust Abatement Committee (GDAC), originally formed in 1973 in response to the severe dust storms which detrimentally affected the community and the Goldfields' environment. Having taken over from the GDAC in 1984, KBULG today operates out of and manages Karlkurla Bushland Park, one of the original six regeneration zones devised by the GDAC to protect the City from dust storms.

Continuing on from the GDAC, a core mission of KBULG remains the conservation of intact bushland and the 're-greening' of urban spaces, whilst having evolved to be a major driving force behind environmental education activities in the Goldfields.

KBULG's ongoing dedication and commitment to the environment and community of the Goldfields were recognised by its partners and sponsors who came together in March 2023 to reflect on KBULG's history and to discuss directions for the future.

To commemorate KBULG's 50th anniversary three events were held over March 17th – March 18th, celebrating the dedication & achievements of KBULG's staff, volunteers, committee members, sponsors and partners. This included a Civic Reception by Mayor John Bowler at the Kalgoorlie Town Hall, a tree planting followed by a morning tea at Centennial Park organised by the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder, and a sundowner within KBULG's Community Nursery sponsored by Northern Star Resources.

With participants from near and afar these events provided many opportunities to discuss and plan future environmental projects and activities benefiting the Goldfields environment, enabling sustainable resource extraction and industrial developments, and contributing to a sustainable future for generations to come.

TIDY TOWNS AWARDS - 2022

In collaboration with the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder, KBULG again entered Kalgoorlie-Boulder into the 2022 state-level Keep Australia Beautiful Council's Tidy Towns Sustainable Communities Competition. Kalgoorlie-Boulder was declared State Award Winner for the category:

Heritage and Culture

The award recognised the dedicated work of KBULG, the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder, the Goldfields Language centre and the Eastern Goldfields Historical Society to keep the region's history and culture alive in many ways.

KBULG was able to showcase the many projects that had been implemented across the eight competition categories and the dedicated enthusiasm of community members to contribute to long-term sustainability of our city.



KEEP AUSTRALIA BEAUTIFUL WA & KBULG COMMUNITY COLLABORATION

KBULG and Keep Australia Beautiful have continued to work together to promote the anti-littering message at our annual environmentally - focused events. The KAB WA team attended the 2022 Tree Planting Day and organised a clean-up session alongside the tree planting event. This initiative has led to a substantial amount of litter being removed from our city and has also enabled to incorporation of fun interactive education activities developed by the KAB Team.

KBULG would like to especially thank Shirley Brindley from the Keep Australia Beautiful WA Council for her ongoing support of KBULG, in addition to all her inspiring collaborative work for the benefit of the entire Western Australian community.





MEMBERSHIP

In 2003 KBULG introduced the possibility of becoming a member of our organisation and being enlisted as a friend of KBULG. During the 2022/2023 time period the number of registered members approximated 650. KBULG regularly updates its members with information in regards to the group's activities and upcoming events, while also encouraging members to get involved in Landcare activities and to assist KBULG with the organisation and delivery of events.

KBULG is very grateful to those members who contribute their valuable time to assist with various aspects of KBULG's work, including nursery work/Karlkurla Bushland Park maintenance and stallholder activities at events. It is an extremely rewarding and gratifying privilege for the KBULG team to witness a growing interest in conservation activities among community members from all age groups and cultural & professional backgrounds.

VOLUNTEERING AT KBULG

KBULG welcomes anyone who wishes to volunteer at its community nursery irrespective of skill and mobility level. KBULG has several regular volunteers who visit the nursery with their carers on a weekly basis. We consider ourselves fortunate to be their hosts and are grateful for the diversity they bring to KBULG. The input of dedicated volunteers over 2022/2023 enabled KBULG to donate thousands of plant seedlings to community groups, communal spaces, community events (i.e. KBULG's annual Kalgoorlie-Boulder Tree Planting Day), and schools that create native gardens with KBULG's assistance.





KBULG'S FULLY INCLUSIVE COMMUNITY NURSERY

KBULG maintains an open community nursery and Eco & Cultural Education Centre (opened in June 2017) in Karlkurla Bushland Park, providing a free space for community organisations and educational providers to run courses and activities for the benefit of the community. Over the 2022/2023 period KBULG's community nursery has been open to the public daily on weekdays from 8am to 12pm (with the exception of a Christmas holiday closure from 17th December 2022 -4th January 2023). KBULG has been receiving visitors seeking information about local plants and waterwise gardening on an almost daily basis. Due to increasing concerns about the City's water supply, KBULG has experienced a pronounced interest from the public water-efficient gardening practices. Correspondingly, KBULG nursery staff has increasingly been conveying skills in propagating local droughtadapted plants to interested community members.

KBULG'S JUNIOR LANDCARE

A major focus of all aspects of KBULG's work and envisaged future projects continues to be the education of younger generations, paving the way for a more sustainable future for the Goldfields and all of Australia. The Junior Landcare Program (JLP) is accordingly one of KBULG's most significant priorities and KBULG continually monitors the success of ongoing education activities, while investigating opportunities for new projects involving the young.

Over 2022/2023 KBULG collaborated with the City's ten primary schools and three secondary schools, with KBULG inviting all school teachers of the region to benefit from the organisation's environmental expertise and welcoming any type of interest from schools in educational programs. KBULG accommodated any request from schools in relation to Junior Landcare education and over the last year continued to go out of its way to respond to specific requirements. Frequently organised activities included educational bushwalks with the duration and educational content adapted to the class' needs, tree planting events on school grounds and classroom talks & activities (with a strong emphasis on promoting sustainable resource use and conservation of biodiversity). KBULG provided schools with regular updates, information and reminders about its activities, in addition to encouraging schools' involvement in KBULG's major community events such as the rECOnstructed Art Competition, the Annual Clean-up Kalgoorlie-Boulder Day and the Annual Kalgoorlie-Boulder Tree-Planting Day.

KBULG continues to receive extremely positive feedback from participating schools in regards to the group's ongoing commitment to Junior Landcare education. We are grateful for the passion and dedication of our schools' amazing teaching staff and are looking forward to partake in many more exciting projects and activities.





KBULG & THE WASTE SORTED SCHOOLS PROGRAM

Over 2022/2023 KBULG continued to deliver the Waste Sorted Program in collaboration with Waste Wise Schools. The program entails waste audits, Earthcycling education and other waste-reducing or reusing activities. The aim of the project is to create more sustainable schools within Kalgoorlie-Boulder and to build a better understanding of sustainability in our younger generations. On behalf of the program, KBULG provides the schools, primary and secondary, with the tools and assistance to promote waste-conscious behaviour.

Over 2022/2023 KBULG staff has liaised with multiple schools and staff members to discuss topics relevant to waste avoidance and the adaptation of measures to enhance sustainability such as the acquisition of a composting system. KBULG also continued to promote social media posts from Waste Wise Schools and other sustainable organisations to the wider community, in addition to maintaining the Environmental Education and Sustainability Network. MEDIA

KBULG is regularly featured in the local media and over 2022/2023 numerous articles reporting about KBULG's activities, events and various projects were published. KBULG aims to reach a diverse range of community members with information about its activities and ongoing projects, and therefore invests considerable efforts into maintaining fruitful working relationships with a variety of media outlets, including but not limited to: the Kalgoorlie Miner, Radio West, ABC Radio and GWN.

KBULG proactively informs the local media about its activities and responds to requests for interviews or other information in a timely manner. Our successful working relationships with media outlets facilitate KBULG's frequent local news presence, numerous feature articles, and regular interviews with KBULG staff.

NEWSLETTERS

KBULG's community bi-annual newsletters are reflections of KBULG's ideals and values and are an effective way of disseminating information to the wider Kalgoorlie-Boulder community. They feature environmental education, sustainable living ideas, earth friendly kids projects, flora and fauna information and offer insight into KBULG's activities within the community.

The four-page, coloured, centre-spread newsletter is published in the Saturday edition of the Kalgoorlie Miner. With the newsletter content presented in an entertaining and easily understandable format, KBULG consistently receives exceptionally positive feedback from the community. Any interested individual can also request the latest issue of the newsletter from KBULG and it can also be downloaded from the KBULG website.

SOCIAL MEDIA ENGAGEMENT & WEBSITE

With the growing use of social media, community engagement in our projects and activities has become increasingly straightforward and effective. KBULG's Facebook page is very active and publishes frequent posts. Over the 2022/2023 reporting period KBULG's social media website has reached over 1,300 followers.

In addition to sharing KBULG's events and activities with a growing number of Facebook followers, KBULG provides news and recommendations on sustainable living and green households through regular posts. We also utilise Facebook to promote our Partners and Sponsors.

KBULG' more recently also joined Instagram (@kbulg_1994). The Instagram page was set up in August 2021 and has currently over 165 followers with a steady stream of additional followers.

KBULG's website facilitates public access to information about the organisation's background and objectives, current and past projects & activities, upcoming events, and facts about the region's conservation needs. RAISING ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS AT DISPLAYS, EXPOS AND FESTIVALS

KBULG ensures that it maintains a high visibility throughout the calendar year by participating with stalls at all major community events to keep up its strong and personal rapport with individual community members.

This constant engagement allows KBULG to maintain its status as the Goldfields most active environmental community organisation. KBULG participated in CKB's 2022 Spring Festival and KBCCI's 2023 Community Expo, answering questions from community members and encouraging all event participants to sign up to our membership list, allowing us to advertise events directly to individuals. KBULG also provided information on waterwise gardening at the events and sells local native plants from its nursery.

KBULG takes advantage of any opportunity to inform community members about the group's projects and activities relevant to individuals' particular interests and concerns, whilst raising awareness about current local environmental issues and sharing advice & educational materials. The fun and informal setting of large community events provides us with many opportunities to extent the group's membership network and contacts for collaborative projects. KBULG's consistent participation at the many community events over the year enables us to evaluate the community's needs and interests in relation to environmental and societal issues, and provides us with essential ideas and input for the development of new projects and activities.

KBULG 's Community Nursery is frequently utilised by other community groups and organisations in the Goldfields. The Rotary Club of Boulder, the Goldfields Naturalists and Artgold Inc. are just some of the groups who request the use of our facilities to host small events. ANNUAL TREE PLANTING DAY

KBULG's Annual Tree Planting Day has long established itself as the region's major annual conservation-focussed event. Tree Planting Day, hosted in conjunction with National Tree Planting Day, is a fun, multi-generational, inspiring community event, and continues to attract many environmentally-conscious individuals, local industry professionals and families. Each year KBULG and CKB select a barren area for revegetation based on visual amenity considerations and conservation needs.

Last year's event, held on July 31st 2022, complimented revegetation efforts commenced in 2019 and 2021, focusing on revegetating a section of the bare area between Centennial Park and Meldrum Avenue in close proximity to Gribble Creek. Restoring the area with native vegetation will not only significantly improve its visual amenity, but also suppress dust and create habitats for animals.

More than 200 enthusiastic community members helped KBULG to revegetate the bare area of bushland with 4000 seedlings, propagated in KBULG's community nursery. Thanks to the excellent site preparation by CKB and the enthusiasm of the community the seedlings, well suited to the harsh environment of the site, were planted in less than two hours. The hard work and outstanding motivation demonstrated by the volunteers who were blessed with a beautiful sunny winter morning, was rewarded with a free sausage sizzle and a prize raffle with various prizes. It was heartwarming to experience the extraordinarily high level of care and commitment among community members from all walks of life towards transforming our City into a more sustainable and greener place to live.

KBULG's Tree Planting Day was fortunate to be supported by the Keep Australia Beautiful (KAB) Team who travelled to the event to assist us with a huge clean-up effort of the area. A staggering 20kg of litter was removed from the planting site & surrounds by the KAB team and a number of incredible volunteers from the community.

KBULG could not have organised the event without the crucial support from the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder who carried out important site preparation works, provided on-ground support on the day and have maintained the area since the initial planting. SUSTAINABLE GARDEN OUEST

KBULG's Sustainable Garden Quest, organised annually in Spring, has become an important event for individuals engaged or interested in sustainable, waterwise gardening in the Kalgoorlie-Boulder region. A major objective of the competition is to raise awareness about opportunities for waterwise gardening and to share relevant techniques. In 2022 the competition again consisted of five separate categories and a report announcing the category winners was published by the Kalgoorlie Miner on the 15th of September 2022.

Due to the high publicity of the event and enthusiastic uptake of the community, the Sustainable Garden Quest again demonstrated to be very effective in promoting innovative ideas for waterwise gardening and sustainable landscaping.

The event invites every resident engaged in waterwise gardening and sustainable landscaping practices to share their passion and individual approaches with like-minded residents, with the KBULG Team ready to provide encouragement and useful advice, in addition to awarding prizes.

The Water Corporation is the major sponsor of the event as the competition aligns with the Corporation's vision to promote sustainable water use, with the choice of native, droughtadapted plants being one major judging component. RECONSTRUCTED ART COMPETITION

KBULG's rECOnstructed Art Competition and Exhibition has established itself as a major, annual community event inspiring residents to make functional and aesthetic use of what would, in other contexts, be defined as waste. The competition has become increasingly popular with schools and community groups, and has also resulted in passionate individuals, young and old, enthusiastically conceptualising entries over the winter. School classrooms across Kalgoorlie-Boulder have incorporated the competition as a major part of their Art Curriculum and this has led to a large number of young community members and their families to get actively involved in recycling, leading to a positive change in the wider community. The competition doesn't impose any rules on the types of materials that can be used, encouraging the free flow of imagination.

Coinciding with National Recycling Week, and with the intention to raise awareness of the importance to 'Reduce, Reuse, Recycle', the competition was held in November 2022. The competition again met its objective to reach a wide audience and attracted a large number of high-quality entries that were displayed in the British Arms Hotel of the Museum of the Goldfields.

With 7 separate categories and cash prizes for each, judges had the difficult task to choose from some superbly creative pieces of artwork from Kalgoorlie-Boulder and surrounding regions.

Competition category winners were announced at the exhibition opening night on Friday,11th of November 2022. KBULG and the independent volunteer judges from art and waste management backgrounds were extremely impressed by the diversity of entries. The thoughtfully designed artworks from recycled and no longer used materials were exhibited in a highly visible 2-week Arts exhibition that proved popular with a wide audience consisting of locals and visitors to the popular landmark.

CLEAN-UP KALGOORLIE-BOULDER DAY

KBULG hosts an annual Kalgoorlie-Boulder Clean-Up Australia Day – a nationwide initiative promoted through state - specific Keep Australia Beautiful Councils. An important objective of the event is to raise awareness about the large amount of waste generated across the City and to 'Avoid, Reduce, Reuse and Recycle' whenever possible. The Clean-Up Day event is held at a different location every year, selected based on litter quantity, conservation significance and visual amenity priority.

This year's Clean-Up Kalgoorlie-Boulder Day was held at Mt Charlotte Reservoir and, originally scheduled for its regular March date, had to be postponed to Sunday, May 21st 2023, due to necessary prior remediation works undertaken by the Water Corporation. One of Kalgoorlie-Boulder's most prominent landmarks and associated with great historical significance, Mt Charlotte's bushland is unfortunately subjected to an ongoing influx of litter that blows onto the site from the Goldfields Highway.

The morning was a great success with nearly 40 volunteers joining the clean-up effort, before being rewarded with a free sausage sizzle and various raffle prizes. It was great to see so many families participate with their young children already well aware of the importance of picking up rubbish rather than walking past it. The event was supported by the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder's green team with assistance on the day and during the lead-up to the event, while Cleanaway provided free skip bins.

KBULG AND NAIDOC WEEK CELBRATIONS

KBULG responds to invitations from primary and secondary schools to attend NAIDOC events, and on request supports schools with organised tailor-made activities. Our activities, adapted to the relevant age groups, aim to develop both environmental and cultural understanding and knowledge.

In 2023 KBULG was fortunate to attend Hannan's Primary NAIDOC Celebrations that entailed the official opening of the school's 'Living Art Garden' - a collaborative project supported by KBULG.

KBULG was also excited about the enthusiastic uptake of an Arts activity that the group had organised for South Kalgoorlie Primary School's NAIDOC event.



COLLABORATION WITH CURTIN UNIVERSITY

In April 2023 Curtin University students took part in a week-long environment and social governance program organised by Curtin University's WA School of Mines. As part of the program students engaged in discussions around environmental sustainability and rehabilitation with industry representatives and landcare staff, with students spending two days at KBULG's community nursery to learn about the propagation of native flora, the history of the organisation, and the importance of learning from past mistakes committed in favour of economic development.

KBULG took the opportunity to highlight the crucial need for the mining industry to work together with environmental professionals and community groups to ensure a sustainable exploration of resources. Students were also made aware of the critical significance to consider the issue of environmental rehabilitation into mine development projects. Representatives from Northern Star Resources and Evolution Mining's local mining operations joined the educational sessions held by KBULG.

Students from the program later volunteered at Kalgoorlie-Boulder's Annual Treeplanting Day, planting the seedlings they propagated in the nursery months earlier, while also assisting to clean up the area with the KAB team.

SCHOOL INCURSIONS & EXCURSIONS

KBULG continues to actively engage with students from Kalgoorlie-Boulder's ten primary schools and three secondary schools. Our aim is to teach the young generation about the importance of learning from past mistakes committed in favour of economic development that resulted in detrimental outcomes for the environment and the community of the Goldfields.

We also hope to inspire an interest in the biodiversity of Karlkurla Bushland Park and the uniqueness of the greater Western Woodlands area through conveying information about key species in the park and also explaining their significance as bush tucker and bush medicine for the Aboriginal population.

Over 2022/2023 KBULG was approached by both local and non-local schools to conduct incursions & excursions and to participate in school-hosted events. Our educational bushwalks continue to be a especially popular service with schools from all year groups, both local and from outside the Goldfields Region.



KBULG encouraged the involvement of schools in the Sustainable Garden Quest 2022 and rECOnstructed Art Competition 2022, and was elated about a class from North Kalgoorlie Primary School being chosen not only as the winner of the Primary School category, but also pronounced winner of the rECOnstructed **People's Choice Award 2022**.

LIVING ART PROJECT WITH HANNANS PRIMARY SCHOOL

KBULG is proud to have been part of a Cultural Community Art Project with students from Hannans Primary School, commenced in May 2023. The project has been implemented in partnership with the school, Evolution Mining and Aboriginal Elders Edie & Danny Ulrich.

Students had the opportunity to learn about local native plants, their habitats and traditional uses. Getting acquainted with natives such as mulga and saltbush, students were also treated to tastings of honey ants and quandong jam. The project culminated with the creation of a 'Living Art Garden' that was formally opened during NAIDOC Week celebrations.

The innovative collaborative community project, aimed at raising young students' awareness of local environmental & cultural heritage, was extremely successful with students, teachers and the community. We hope that it will set a best practice example and provide an inspiration for many classroom projects to come.







BENEFITS OF LONG-TERM SPONSORSHIP RELATIONSHIPS

KBULG receives strong support from it's many industry partners. PROMOTING INDIGENOUS KNOWLEDGE & CULTURAL UNDERSTANDING

A core objective of KBULG remains the fostering of cultural understanding within the community. All our Junior Landcare activities incorporate about the Goldfields' unique components Aboriginal heritage, traditional uses of fauna and flora, and the Aboriginal naming of species.

KBULG collaborates with local Aboriginal guides in the development and conduction of educational bushwalks and encourages Aboriginal residents to convey their knowledge about bush tucker and bush medicine with the community, and to share their stories with the wider public.

KBULG routinely consults with Aboriginal Elders when developing educational activities, and promotes their engagement in collaborative projects whenever possible, with the aim to build cultural pride and to foster cultural understanding within the community. KBULG also continues to expand its engagement with Aboriginal youth and supports their participation in education and training courses within KBULG's Community Nursery and Eco & Cultural Education Centre.

Looking back at the last year, we are very proud to have been able to recognise 50 years of KBULG and the many projects and activities that KBULG and its predecessor, the Goldfields Dust Abatement Committee, have implemented around the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder, and across the Goldfields region.






